[解答例] If I were the author, I would answer that a parent's job is never to give up on their children's happiness, but instead to commit themselves to finding all possible solutions to support their children in overcoming their difficulties and becoming strong enough to stand on their own feet. (49 words)

問題4の解答欄

[解答例 1] The most notable feature in these rankings is that happiness and income do not necessarily go hand in hand. For example, Tokyo, where the average yearly income ranks first, is second from the bottom in happiness. In contrast, the happiest prefecture, Okinawa, ranks last in income. This suggests that higher income doesn't guarantee greater happiness. Additionally, climate may play a role in people's happiness, as five of the top ten happiest prefectures are located in Kyushu and Okinawa. A warmer climate is often associated with a more relaxed lifestyle, which could contribute to higher happiness and well-being. (97 words)

[解答例 2] These two rankings combined show that higher income does not necessarily bring happiness. This is most evident in the case of Okinawa, which is the happiest among all 47 prefectures, despite having an average income lower than that of any other prefecture. In the happiness ranking, Okinawa is followed by Kagoshima and Miyazaki, which also rank significantly lower in terms of income. In sharp contrast, Tokyo and Kanagawa hold the first and second positions, respectively, in the income ranking, yet they come in at 46th and 45th when it comes to happiness. Thus, it is safe to conclude that more money does not equate to more happiness. (107 words)
