Example1

According to this line graph, the difference in percentage between the two sexes is very significant with only 6.16 percent of male workers taking childcare leave compared to 82.2 percent of their female counterparts even as recently as in 2018. However, it's not very surprising considering the long-persisting conventional employment practices in this country, where more important job responsibilities are given to men. This, I believe, is one of the reasons why many men are still reluctant to take the leave despite their legally-provided right to do so. (88 words)
